Overview: Assessed reflective functioning through early childhood memories of

African American women in primary care. The study compared reflective functioning in women with insecure and secure attachment profiles. A modified version of Peter Fonagy's Reflective Functioning Scale was applied to the early memory narratives. Results indicated reflective functioning scores of one of seven early memories (Happiest) reached statistical significance. All correlations were in the expected direction with only secure attachment significantly correlating with

reflective functioning.
